#### INT. LIVING ROOM - CONTINUOUS

As goes to sit back down on his couch, his power suddenly cuts out and he's left in the dark. He gives out a single groan.

# INT. BASEMENT - CONTINUOUS

He stomps from his couch over to the basement stairs, which he descends at a groggy pace. Reaching the bottom of the flight of stairs, he pats the wall looking for his breaker panel, eventually finding and opening it. He flips his breakers back on and breathes a sigh of relief, turning back towards the stairs. He begins to head back up, but not before noticing a small doll in the corner of the room. He gives it a small look of confusion before climbing back up to the living room.

### INT. LIVING ROOM/ DINING ROOM - CONTINUOUS

As he re-enters the room, he notices that his TV has switched back on.

His attention is interrupted by a chair at his dining room table being moved a few feet across the room. His face becomes stern for a moment before he crosses the room and whips a laptop out of his work bag, placing it on the dining room table and searching "How to perform an exorcism."

INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

The Electrician covers every doorway in his home with a line of salt.

INT. KITCHEN - DAY

The Electrician places a TV dinner lasagna in his oven.

INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

The Electrician shouts bible verses while holding a cross and bible.

THE ELECTRICIAN (head towards the ceiling) BE SOBER, BE VIGILANT; BECAUSE YOUR ADVERSARY THE DEVIL, AS A ROARING LION, WALKETH ABOUT, SEEKING WHOM HE MA--

INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

The Electrician sits on his couch, attempting to meditate. His hands are raised into the air, doing an odd hand gesture. His face twitches a bit as if a fly is bothering him. The oven loudly BEEPS. He opens his eyes and sighs in defeat.

INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

The Electrician sits on his couch, eating his Lasagna and watching the movie on his TV. As a certain scene begins to play, his eyes light up and he places his fork back onto his plate.

# INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

While the scene plays on his TV, the Electrician mimics the priest from the Exorcist; holding the same cross and bible as earlier.

THE ELECTRICIAN (repeatedly) THE POWER OF CHRIST COMPELS YOU--

As he mimics the speech, his plate is pushed off the table and his food is splattered across the floor. He stops his speech and whips around to look at the plate, a look of fury in his eyes.

INT. LIVING ROOM - DAY

The Electrician storms back over to his laptop and begins to read from his screen. On his laptop a forum page with comments going back and forth can be seen.

> THE ELECTRICIAN (V.O.) (reading off computer, person 1) Well see, the obvious way to deal with a ghost is to find something it's attached to in order to communicate with it. Maybe it had a toy it really liked or something like that?

> THE ELECTRICIAN (V.O.) (reading off computer, person 2) You seriously expect to be able to just put out some bait and magically be able talk with a ghost? How exactly do you think you're gonna be able to talk to it?

THE ELECTRICIAN (V.O.) (reading off computer, person 1) Well I mean, you could hire a medium if it weren't for quarantine. Maybe you could throw some sort of powder onto it to force it to reveal itself? I don't know. THE ELECTRICIAN (V.O.) (reading off computer, person 2) There is no WAY you think that would work. I say you should just find whatever the spirit is attached to and find a way to electrocute it. Just fry the sucker.

The Electrician glances towards the basement stairs for a moment before zoning off, lost in thought.

INT. LIVING ROOM - NIGHT

The Electrician stands by his dining room table, placing a somewhat heavy bag of flour down on the chair. On the table is a car battery with a single jumper cable attached to it, which runs down to the other side of the room where a large aluminum foil sheet lies on the floor. In the middle of the sheet, the small dusty doll from earlier sits upright, a sown smile on it's face.

The Electrician lets out a sigh before looking at the other jumper cable in his hand. He gives a glance towards the car battery before he hears the aluminum foil rustle slightly. The doll shifts its head and is raised into the air about two feet. With panic in his eyes, the Electrician looks at the car battery and the doll before dropping the jumper cable and throwing the flour at the specter.

As the dust settles, a YOUNG GIRL, 11, can be seen in a white dress, coughing the flour out of her lungs. The Electrician reaches out to her, a look of guilt is in his eyes but he smiles softly.

THE ELECTRICIAN Hey, it's alright. I didn't know.

He squats down slightly, putting his hand on her shoulder as she wipes tears out of her eyes.
